## ELNEC Faculty Hold Course in Tajikistan: Reconnect with Past ELNEC Trainer

In October, Nessa Coyle, PhD, RN, Patrick Coyne, MSN, RN, Judith Paice, PhD, RN, and Thomas Smith, MD traveled to Eastern Europe to provide an ELNEC train-the-trainer course for nurses and physicians in Tajikistan. Forty-two healthcare providers attended this interdisciplinary course. While teaching the course, these faculty members were reacquainted with Nielbi Khasanova, a nurse who had attended an ELNEC course a couple of years ago at the Scloss Arenberg in Salzburg, Austria.

Nielbi started "Nursing Hospital" several years ago in Tajikistan that she was very excited for the ELNEC faculty to visit. She recently opened up an area of the hospital specifically for palliative care, and she is currently applying for a license to be able to carry opioids (parenteral morphine primarily). It appears that there is a limited supply of fentanyl in Tajikistan, and it is only given by anesthesiologists.

Remarkably, Nielbi has pulled together the support to develop this free-standing hospital almost single-handedly. Despite the fact that most people do not have electricity 24 hours/day, Nielbi is still able to provide excellent care to her patients and their families. To ensure that her patients have food, she grows vegetables and fruits and is developing a rabbit farm as another source of food. She is highly-respected by her peers and viewed as a leader in Tajikistan.
